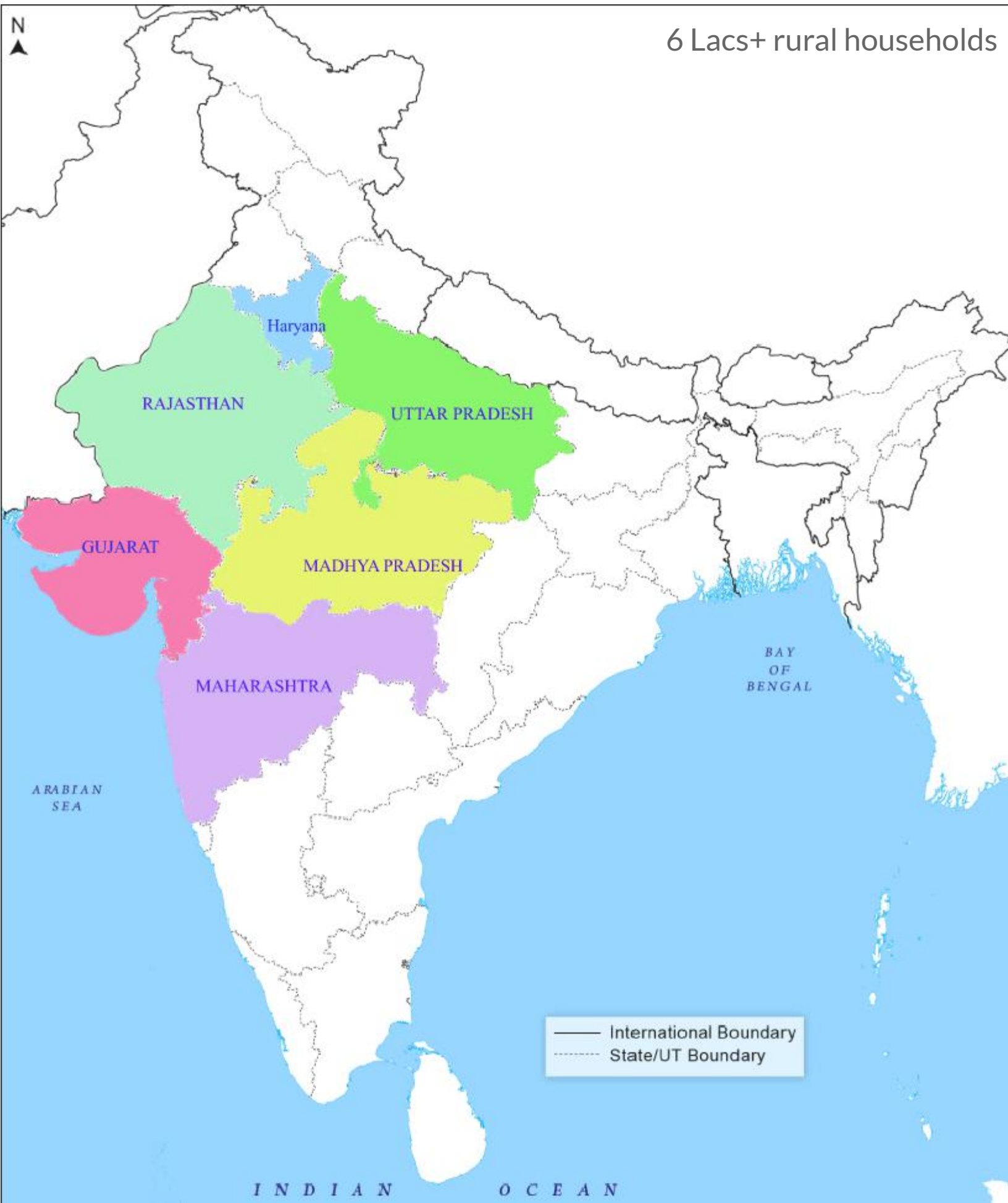

Water management



Water Management

Making potable water available in the draught prone areas

Barmer district (Rajasthan state) is a drought-prone area where average rainfall falls under 277 mm every year. Due to unfavorable weather, soil conditions, and water availability, it becomes very difficult to get water in a nearby area. Hence, local people have to walk 4-5 kilometers to fetch potable water. This task increased women's drudgery and the time required to fetch water. Also, it affected the education and health of rural girls and women. To solve this problem Arpan has made sincere efforts by constructing beri and renovating existing beris and pond to make potable water available in the nearby areas.

Spreading happiness

Arpan has built new “beri”, and renovated two existing “beris”, so that local community can get potable water in nearby areas. It has increased a water availability for 6-8 months annually, whereas previously it was only available for 3-4 months during the monsoon season.



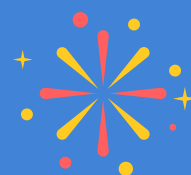
With the renovation of the Singada community pond, rainwater is being stored for 4-5 months. It is providing sufficient water to the villagers to meet their routine water consumption activities.

Water Management

Water Economic Zone

There is a good rain fall availability in the Kurawad block, Udaipur district but conserving this water has been all time issue for a local villagers. Hence, in order to increase ground water level and water availability in a water resources Arpan has created Water Economic Zones through Integrated Watershed Development. It has covered the area of 4727 ha of two Macro's Watershed and can store rainwater as well as it can be utilized for irrigation and drinking purpose by the surrounding farmers. In addition to this Arpan has also created 13 Mini percolation tanks (MPT) with waste weir in order to increase groundwater and rainwater storage.

Ensuring water security

6 water harvesting structure has been constructed by the gram panchayat for the water and soil conservation in the Bhim block of Rajasmand district. The damaged stone wall of 5 pastureland area are strengthened with stones in patches. 551 Forestry plantation and grass seeding was done in Rao ji ka Talab pastureland by user community in convergence with the Panchayat Samiti. This structures are managed and maintained by the water user groups created by the Arpan to to ensure 100% drinking water security to all families.



Water Management

Rajgarh, Sehore and Vidisha are the most underprivileged as well as water scarce districts of the Madhya Pradesh. Hence, it was crucial to develop water source in order to revive the agriculture sector in a rural locality. Arpan has developed various water resources through pond deepening, stop dam, well deepening and community pond and it is benefiting 671 farmers to enhance their agricultural production.



Arpan has brought 362 acres of unirrigated land under irrigation and 71 acres of uncultivable land has been brought under vegetation. This has directly increased the income of the 905 farmers of the Rajgarh district.

Water Harvesting Structure



07 Stop Dams, 13 Farm Ponds and 02 Community Pond have been constructed in Vidisha district. In addition to these, 01 pond has been deepened and 10 existing wells have been deepened with renovation work. These structures have brought 1110 acres of land under irrigation.

Contribution to the Watershed Management Scheme



Arpan has provided 111 trainings to the 4170 beneficiaries in Baran, Churu, Tonk and Savai Madhopur districts of the Rajasthan state. These beneficiaries are from 60 different villages of these districts. Presently, these beneficiaries are successfully managing watershed structures for ensuring continuous supply of the water.

Village Water and Sanitization committee is formed to maintain water resources and made functional to prepare village action plan. It has provided water connection for **210 households and 210 stationary kit** is distributed to the individuals for maintaining better record of the activities. Apart from this, Arpan has conducted various exposure visits to bring awareness in rural community.



ARPAN is significant agency for carrying out documentation and monitoring evaluation of 249 IWMP projects covering about 3828 villages with more than 4 lakh households of the Rajasthan state. Apart from this, final impact evaluation has been carried out and reports are submitted to the concerned department.



Creating livelihood

Livelihood



Goat rearing

Arpan has reached out to 130 families and empowered them to start their own goat farming unit in Vidisha, Sehore and Rajgarh districts. Here 12 SHG groups of women have started goat rearing in the same project area.

Aarogya Sakhi

Arogya Sakhi is a home-based antenatal and infancy programme that trains women from the community to give home-based preventive care and perform diagnostic during antenatal and infancy period, leading to timely intervention with appropriate treatment. Medical tool Kit including fully automated Nebulizer, BP Operator Machine and First aid tool Box with Bag are given to these Arogya Sakhis. 16 Arogya Sakhis have been trained and working. Besides, the programme visualizes the creation of women entrepreneurs who are able to provide affordable healthcare to women and children in the villages.



Carpenter training

7 days training on carpentry work has enabled people to increase their income and earn their livelihood.

Masala Unit



With the continuous support of the Arpan, one Masala Unit is being started and functioned by the 5 local women in the Jhukar Jogi village of Later in tehsil of Vidisha district (Madhya Pradesh). Through this production unit 5 women have increased their income up to 4 to 5 thousands per month.

Skill development training



Vocational skill plays vital role in ensuring livelihood to the rural households. Hence, various skill development trainings such as beauty parlor training, pickle making training etc. are been provided to the rural women and empowered them to become independent and earn their own livelihood.



Farm livelihood



1 Doubling the income of the farmers

Arpan has rigorously put efforts to double the income of the farmers while ensuring socio-environmental sustainability in the Satna district of the Madhya Pradesh. Under on-farm demonstration, crop diversification is promoted among the farmers and 15 farmers are benefited with Onion seed, and fertilizers. These 15 progressive farmers from five villages were identify and benefited from the awareness about the bio fertilizers and training as well as plastic drum are provided for multiplication of Fertilizers. In addition to this, 50 Kitchen Garden has been developed at project villages.



2 Developing farmers

In Rajgarh district, Arpan has provided improved variety crop demonstrations of wheat and gram, to 169 farmers and developed 30 vermi-composting units. Further, 686 farmer have got 30 trainings on improved crop practices, Integrated Nutrient and Pest Management, improved irrigation practices, Vegetable cultivation etc. In Vidisha district, 101 farmers have been benefited through the Improve variety of crop demonstration activities. GW - 322 Foundation variety of wheat and RVG - 202 foundation variety of Gram seeds are grown by the farmers.



Empowering farmers

In Vidisha district Multi-tier cropping pattern is been adopted by the 60 farmers and it has enabled them to earn minimum Rs. 70 to 75 thousand in a season. Apart from this, intercropping fruiting plants has increased their annual income foundation seeds of wheat and gram and 50 Farmers have started growing coriander crops in total 125 acres of land. This is the first commercialized farming and each farmer is able to harvest 18-20 quintals of coriander. Presently, in single harvesting, farmers are able to earn average 1.64 lakhs.

Animal Husbandry

Animal health care

- Farm mechanization seems to have become, to a certain extent, the neglected stray of agricultural and rural development. Appropriate mechanization is capable of protecting natural capital and the environment whilst boosting food production. Hence, Arpan has distributed farm tools to provide improved farm tool to the women's generally engaged in farm labour activities and empower them. Fifteen women agriculture laborers or the women generally engaged in their own filed were benefited from this activity.



Animal husbandry

In the Reengus block of the Sikar district, Arpan is promoting Azolla cultivation, usage of mineral mixtures and green fodder for the better animal health. In addition to this, Arpan is promoting bio gas plant among the rural communities so the fuel consumption can be reduced. Apart from this, Arpan has organized various exposure tours for the farmers so that they can acquire modern practices for the animal husbandry work.

Initiatives under agriculture development



Sanjeevani eco park is developed through plantations (Fruits and Forestry) and vegetable cultivation activities in the Kurawad block of the Udaipur district.

Kitchen gardening is promoted through SSPV, which has significantly increased the nutritional food production at door step and reduced the expenditure on the vegetables in 200 rural poor families and 25 schools.



Farmer Producer Company formed in order to provide end-to-end support and services to the small farmers, and cover technical services, marketing, processing, and others aspects of agriculture inputs.

Animal Husbandry

Animal health care

Arpan has conducted a survey of 2963 cattle rearing families from 16 villages of Manesar in Gurugram district, Haryana for checking the animal health status. Animals health check – up camps are conducted by Veterinary Department, Govt of Haryana. 162 farmers are benefiting from the Mineral Mixture and Dewormer tablets facilities and health checkup camps for the better livestock management. These check-ups led to better health of animals, reduction in mortality rate and increase in milk yield of the cattles.



Animal husbandry

In the Rajgarh district, 75 farmers are introduced with improved variety of fodder crops (Berseem) and 30 Azolla units are constructed for increasing milk production and better health of animals. 1451 animals are treated through 15 health checkup camps. 30 Feeder units are provided for improving animal health and reduction in seasonal diseases. In addition to this, 55 pastoralists' have changed their cattle feeding style by cultivating berseem (fodder crop) and 10 families have started Azolla unit at their home. 10 Animal Health Camps have treated 1740 unfit animals by the veterinary experts.



Women empowerment

Creating a equal platform



Empowering adolescent girls

Gender plays a vital role in development of the young generation, and life of the rural adolescent girls are majorly affected by it. Rural adolescent girl's personal development and career growth is highly impacted by gender created obstacle. To bring a change in this scenario, Arpan has provided life skill training to the 657 adolescent girls from the Phulera and Maujamabad block of the Jaipur district and it is effectively enabling them to have proper understanding about their career decisions and life ambitions. These adolescent girls are capacitating as changemaker to fight with any pandemic situation.

Socio-economic development

Arpan has trained 56 SHGs in 4 district in Madhya Pradesh from which 1638 women have benefited. SHG women are trained on financial literacy, better communication skills, leadership skills, managerial skills, roles and responsibilities and boosted up their confidence levels. SHG's women have got goat bucks to generate an additional source of income from it.



Economic empowerment



Vegetable Cultivation and Goatary are chosen as two major livelihood enhancement interventions considering market demand and local resources available. 650 women are engaged in vegetable cultivation, packaging and selling in the local market, whereas 692 women are engaged in goatary. In addition to this, 27 women members have purchased buffaloes and started selling milk. 9 members are engaged in poultry while 93 members are doing fruit selling (custard apple). Apart from this, 138 Micro enterprises were set up for individual or small groups of women like the grocery store, flour mills, beauty parlor, sewing & tailoring etc. 11 self-help groups were formed in this year and this groups are strengthen by the various training on significance of the regular meetings and training on all modules of SHGs.



Health and Sanitation



Fighting back with malnourishment

- In 2021-22, Arpan have treated 48 children and freed from malnourishment through awareness, and children were enrolled in Anganwadi centers in Dhani Boraj Gram Panchayat, Jaipur.
- Pregnant and lactating mothers are linked with the Anganwadi centers.
- Kitchen Nutri-garden is established at 2 Sub-Centre & 16 malnourished families as a demo that is supporting the nutrition enhancement through organic vegetables.

Organizing health camp

Arpan has organized 16 health camps in the Barmer district (Rajasthan), where 1108 villagers have participated. As a result, the local community has got aware of their health issues and status and they have started taking precautions for better health.



Health

Preventing STD related health hazards with various precautionary measures among homosexual men and female sex workers.



Health camp were organized in 16 villages of the Barmer district, where 1108 individual's health check up are done.

In these help camps various STD, hemoglobin, blood pressure, eye related and normal flu were treated and villagers were guided to consult good hospitals for severe disease or health issues.

Sanitation

With support of the Capri financial services, Arpan Seva Sansthan has constructed new toilets for girls and boys are constructed in different schools in Udaipur district.



This has successfully increased the girl student attendance in the school.

It is providing safe sanitation along with encouraging girl child's education.



Education

Support to enable learning



In order to educate children in their home/village places, Arpan is supporting through academic fellows to provide home-based support to these kids. It has enabled them to learn the language and moral stories. Kinder garden training is provided to the 410 kids along with their parents at their home. Arpan has established 10 learning resource centers in the project area, and books and other support is regularly provided to these centers. Learning kits including water bottles, masks, sanitizers, bags, drawing books, and crayons were distributed to 1000+ children in all the project Kookra and Lasadiya Panchayats of Bhim block of Rajsamand district. 1350 kits containing physical and educational development equipment were distributed to 1350 kids. 360 mothers are oriented about the use of these kits through different workshops. Child committee and parliament are formed under which children's regularity, cooperation, covid awareness, and motivational factors are measured. 7 life skill training is been provided to 250 adolescent children to make them capable and independent . Arpan has set a library in a school for increasing the accessibility of a book for a students.

Child friendly learning environment



In Rajgarh district (MP) Arpan is implementing Bala programme in 15 schools for developing child friendly learning and fun based physical environment building in school infrastructure. 5 libraries are set up in 5 villages for students to gain new knowledge, skills and depositions for learning and personal development that they will use through out their lives. In addition to this, 5 smart class is been developed in 5 villages and it is benefiting 1441 students. It has enabled children to learn and memorize the topics for a longer period of time. 15 schools are supported with sports equipment, which is enabling children in building self esteem and develop team and friendship values in their life.

Further, in Sehor district, 05 government schools are supported by the library set up, sports kits, Bala programme and 05 government schools are converted into the smart school which benefited 1877 children.

In Shajapur district also, 5 smart class are installed which benefited 930 children. 20 library set up benefited 2166 children and Bala programme is implemented in 20 schools which is benefiting 2438 children.



In the Vididha district (Madhya Pradesh), Arpan has converted 02 schools are converted into smart school. Through these activities 1935 students are benefiting.

Getting back to the school



Arpan has developed a safe, hygienic, and student-friendly environment in the schools and it has brought back 2657 school dropped out children to the school in the Kurawad block of the Udaipur district in Rajasthan.

Technological innovation

The Western Rajasthan region is predominantly barren, where water has a major quality problem for surface water, seasonal turbidity, and arsenic levels. To solve this problem, Gravity filter (G-Filter) and (Sub-Surface Porous Vessel) SSPV technologies are promoted in the rural communities. This project has reached 200 households and 25 schools in the Bhim block in Rajasamand district of Rajasthan.



Arpan has installed SSPV structure in 200 small or marginalized farmer's roof or backyard. This has enabled farmers to grow a vegetable at home, which has increased their savings up to Rs. 400-500 significantly while providing them nutritious vegetables.

Providing clean drinking water for good health

25 schools and 200 households have installed G-filter in their premises and enjoying clean drinking water facilities with reduced fluoride and at low cost in their homes and schools.

For the infrastructural development of the area, an internal CC road of 55m Meter long and 3-meter width is constructed for better road services. Further, in order to provide safe and hygienic water to the Communities a water tank of 5000 liter capacity is constructed in Salaiya area.

Introducing Water wheel

Water wheel is a unique invention made to reduce a women drudgery in the water scarce village areas. It have been distributed among the rural women and it is benefiting 34 women. It has effectively reduced women drudgery and time consumed for fetching water. Now girls are able to utilize their spare time on study and other activities, rather than bringing water.

National Level Monitoring

Arpan Seva Sansthan have done monitoring of the various rural development schemes in Gujarat and Madhya Pradesh. This regular monitoring was conducted in Bhavnagar, Batod, Chotta Udaipur, Panchamahar, Kutch and Morbi of Gujarat. One special monitoring of MGNREGS and PMAY-G program is done in Mandala and Dindori districts of Madhya Pradesh. .

To support clean and green energy SDG, 10 biogas units are installed by Arpan at farmer's home. This project has benefited 4500+ farmers..

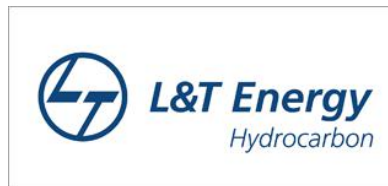
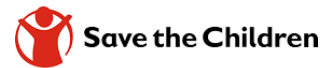
